









Keep your wedding dress close for years to come with locally made lace-imprinted porcelain

combine lace—a fragile memory of days gone by—with the stone-like strength of porcelain to create objects that will be cherished for generations to come," says self-described fabric-aholic and Asheville River Arts District ceramicist Michael Hofman of Hofman Studios (828/232-1401, LiveLifeArtfully.com). Here's how it works: Michael rolls out clay like a piecrust, lays lace atop it, and then applies pressure to transfer the delicately detailed patterns into the porcelain. Hard as it may be to believe, because he removes the fabric immediately, the lace remains as clean as it was before the process. For brides, that means he can preserve your favorite wedding gown accents on any number of dishes, serving pieces, or vases with no consequence to the frock itself.

The made-to-order pieces available in an array of colorsare ready in about a month but since Michael stays busy during peak season (mid-May through December), he advises couples reach out at least three months or more before setting up a registry, as those entail designing a set instead of an individual piece. He holds sets for up to a year so that after the Big Day, any unsold pieces may still be gifted to the couple. Couples are offered a 10 percent discount if they purchase the remainder of their collection themselves.

Whether you mix the end results with your china, stock your home with a full set, or gift pieces (like catchall bowls) as thank-you's, he promises his creations will live up to everyday life. Porcelain, Michael points out, is the strongest of all clays and as fragile as it may look, it's actually oven-, dishwasher-, and microwave-safe. A dainty yet hardy item that's built for the long haul? Sounds like just the stuff a marriage is built on. —Jessica Isaacs

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

utting—or let's be real, smashing—a cake has been a Big Day tradition for generations. But who says you have to stick to the well-worn wedding path? Choose a creative confection (think sundae bars, Popsicles, pretzels) to grace your dessert table and you've infused a bit of tasty fun into the party. We've rounded up our five favorite cake alternatives (or accompaniments if you want to have your cake and eat it, too) to tempt your taste buds. -Lauryn Higgins



#### **SUGAR & SNOW GELATO**

(Asheville; SugarAndSnowGelato.com; 704/616-4140) Chill out in style with this cutie of a cart (left) that serves up the classic frozen Italian dessert. Request a tasting session, then create a customized menu and decide if you want a sundae bar or just-as-good naked scoops. (Want to go at it alone? Self-serve is an option, too.) Book at least six months in advanceespecially if you're saying "I do" in warm weather—as the outfit gets more popular the more temperatures rise.

MOST POPULAR FLAVORS: salted caramel, creamy chocolate, and raspberry sorbet

### **SUNSHINE SAMMIES**

(Asheville; SunshineSammies.com; 828/505-2852) Give your guests a throwback taste of childhood with these handmade ice cream sandwiches served straight from "Sunny" the vintage ice cream truck or its as-yet-unnamed umbrella cart offshoot. With flavors from chocolate and vanilla to mint chocolate and gooey caramel, the options are sure to charm. Book at least two months in advance to ensure you can reserve the setup of your choice. MOST POPULAR FLAVORS: cookie dough, salted caramel, and The Origin





#### **VORTEX DOUGHNUTS**

(Asheville; VortexDoughnuts.com; 828/552-3010)

Vortex Doughnuts has been treating Asheville locals and visitors alike to their award-winning delights since 2014. And a bonus for weddings? With options classic (Old Fashion), meaty (Maple Bacon), and vegan (Strawberry Glazed), there's something for every last guest on your list. If you need more than a few dozen, order a month in advance.

MOST POPULAR FLAVORS: salted caramel, Vortex (cinnamon sugar with dark chocolate swirl), all berry glazes





## POPPY HAND-CRAFTED POPCORN

(Asheville and Black Mountain; PoppyHandcraftedPopcorn.com; 828/552-3149)

Popcorn isn't just for the movies, people! Whether you're looking for a munchable snack for your rehearsal dinner or wedding reception or you're craving a preciously packaged wedding favor, Poppy Popcorn has more than enough to chew on. Flavors—there are 23 as of press time—range from sweet (like cotton candy) to savory (like olive oil and rosemary), and couples can choose popcorn packed into see-through baggies (clear or novelty style), mini popcorn balls on sticks (AKA "popcorn pops"), popcorn made into edible décor (think sticky, sweet popcorn shaped into a Christmas tree), or order popcorn packed into tins. Order three months or more before your event.



While everything is handcrafted, exquisitely made, and divine (expect a massive variety of artisan chocolate bars, caramels, pastries, and cakes), know their decadent—and boy, do we mean decadent—truffles will rival you and your sweetie as the stars of your wedding show. Schedule a tasting to narrow down what flavors you'll tempt guests with.

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## Happy Campers

Travel back to the fabulous '50s at this vintage-themed wedding venue

hanks to JuneBug Retro Resort (828/208-1979; JuneBugRetroResort.com), a 1950s-inspired retro campsite slash wedding venue in Weaverville, North Carolina, gone are the days when fulfilling that "something old" part of the timehonored tradition meant scouring through your grandmother's closet or jewelry box.

Home to 10 vintage campers, several ceremony sites, a reception tent, a selfdescribed "upscale bath house trailer," and a playground dotted with old-school attractions, JuneBug Retro Resort makes for one seriously untraditional wedding getaway for couples (in the area for their vows or honeymooning), their guests, and others. A passion project for owners Tom and Charlene Pagano, the first couple to

exchange vows on the property, it opened last July.

"Our obsession," says Charlene, "started with our very first camper-a 1953 Royal Spartanette that we parked in our driveway." Imagine, she says, that giant silver spaceship just sitting in a north Asheville neighborhood. "When we saw everyone's reaction," she says, "we knew that we really had something special."

She and Tom purchased a 50acre plot less than 15 minutes from downtown Asheville, and planned

#### THE PRICE OF TIME TRAVEL

Book a Friday or Saturday wedding and reception, catering and ceremony tents, plus tables, chairs (up to 200), a lighting and sound system, a wedding arbor, a dance floor, and a bonfire are included. Bookings also cover the exclusive use of grounds, one night's stay in 10 campers for up to 32 quests, and four JuneBug staffers to assist with the wedding day-of. The cost? \$7,500. Book Sunday through Thursday and the price drops to \$5,500. If you aren't marrying there, JuneBug Retro Resort also offers engagement photo sessions for a fee of \$250.

their own wedding while simultaneously developing the property for their minor herd of campers. "In true Tom Pagano fashion," says Charlene, "my knight in stained Carharts pulled through. We installed the playground the day before our wedding so our guests could have the full experience. Despite all the issues beforehand-[permitting mazes, a rainy spring]-our day was perfect. As the event coordinator here now, my goal is to make every bride feel the way I did on my wedding day."

Encircled by mountains, the site is open May through October. Book the entire property for a wedding, and for 24 hours you have access to the trailers, too. And, in keeping with the retro lifestyle, JuneBug is unplugged-meaning there is no TV or Wi-Fi. For couples looking to escape the everyday hustle and bustle of modern times, that's the icing on the (wedding) cake for this venue. -Jessica Isaacs







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
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
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




FLOWER POWER (this page, left to right) "Our vision was to design a bouquet with elegant garden florals and then infuse with flora you'd find in a century-old greenhouse like the Conservatory, near the time when it was built," Eatherley Schultz of Floressence Flowers says. "The juxtaposition of the two creates a really unique, organic feel." Anemones, tulips, hellebore, cappuccino-hued roses, Japanese sweet peas, anthurium, and greenery combine to create a sprawling bridal bouquet that's as fragrant as it is fancy. Fox & Beaux Boutique's 14k rose gold "Tulip Ring," with light green pear-cut and pavé diamonds, is traditional with a twist. hile a sweeping, castle-like view of the 1800s-era, Biltmore House is the typical image that comes to mind when Asheville's most recognizable landmark is mentioned, this February, we at Asheville Wedding Guide aimed for the estate's tucked away Conservatory—just one of nine wedding venues on the grounds-for a fashion and tabletop shoot. Why? The glassroofed Conservatory, built in 1895, never ceases to impress with its stately, arched windows, lush array of exotic plants, outdoor patios, and terraced Butterfly Garden. Plainly put: If you're a bride on the hunt for ambiance à la The Secret Garden, this is your nirvana.

Join us for a look at this lesser known corner of the famed estate, and soak up all that Alise from Alise Taggart Events & Design crafted around a botanical theme. From delicately designed paper goods to artfully arranged décor and elegant place settings (not to mention inspired fashion and beauty), we hope you walk away with a vision for your own Big Day. -Hannah Chillag





few days before Daniel "Dan" Kennedy wed his sweetheart, Brandy Troxler, amid the rolling hills of Leicester, just , northeast of Asheville, he was scouring the shops of "Ashvegas" for a gold plastic bench.

How now, you ask? Well, let's back up to October 2011, when Dan walked into Brandy's house-there via an invite from a mutual pal. By the end of the night, the San Francisco-based pair were inseparable, and the following evening they shared their first smooth on a yellow plastic bench behind said friend's house. "His weird matches my weird," says Brandy, "and that's the best thing that I could ask for." Fast-forward through five years of dating and Dan was down on bended knee proposing to Brandy while they were on a vacation to Tulum, Mexico.

Among the charming odes to the lovebirds was a tiny garden that had sprouted on their sweetheart table. Just like their own California Eden, this one was comprised of succulents. "Those little details kept us smiling all day long," says Brandy. Sounds like just the ingredients a happily ever after calls for. —Molly Ramsey





hen Jennifer of Jennifer Callahan Photography started brainstorming ideas for the ultimate bridal portrait session, "when" and "where" were never in question. "The end of October is when fall colors really pop in the Blue Ridge area," says Asheville-based Jennifer. And she should know, being a seasoned shutterbug of 10-plus years—and an ace in the 828. The Vineyards at Betty's Creek, a posh venue in Sylva, North Carolina, won out for the "where," as its rustic charm yields inevitably romantic imagery. From there, Jennifer partnered with a host of local talent (among them gown designer Angela Kim of Asheville Couture and baker Lex Walton of Layered by Lex) to hatch an autumn-inspired reception in plum purple, fiery red, and amber that complemented the surrounding Great Smoky Mountains.

As for takeaways for brides, Jennifer says start by keeping a fall wedding from being overtly thematic—i.e. stacked pumpkins hither and thither—and select a florist who is "connected with nature," as she puts it. (For this shoot, that was Sweet Stems Flower Bar florist Lauren Barrington, who's known for her knack of combining cultivated garden blooms with foraged, wild elements for an organic, seasonal look.) Next, give trust a try. "When vendors feel trusted, they really soar," says Jennifer. Whether you're a bride in the final countdown, newly engaged and still deciding on your date, or just a woman daydreaming about your "someday" Big Day, enjoy all the inspiration the cool season—and this shoot that celebrates it—brings. —Lauryn Higgins



sk Taylorsville, North Carolina, native Lauren Mays and she'll assure you chivalry is far from dead. For proof, she points to her now-husband, Trey Carter, who pulled out all the gallant stops during the couple's first date in the fall of 2015. "He was the Southern gentleman I had read about in books," she laughs. And nowhere was that more apparent than on one June day in 2016, when Lauren returned home after a morning of running errands to find their pup, Max, in a new Tiffany blue collar. ild or tailored, neutral-hued or colorific, likely you're leaning toward one of these when it comes to your wedding flowers. But have you pondered where those perfect petals will be grown? Lucky for Asheville brides, this corner of the world is rife with vibrant, prolific flower farms, which means you have easy (and likely less pricey) blooms at your fingertips. And these homegrown offerings not only tend to stay perky longer than those ordered from out-of-town (or even international) growers, but also they tend to be more fragrant. "About 85 percent of the flowers that florists buy come from outside of the U.S.," says Niki Irving of Flourish Flower Farm in Candler, North Carolina. "Often that means those flowers were harvested weeks before your wedding to travel thousands of miles." Past the practical bonuses, there's simply something special about dressing your Big Day in blooms snipped within miles of where you swap your vows. Read on for tips to work locally grown flora into your celebration.

Tell your team local is a pribrity. Many flower farms offer full-service floral design for weddings and team up with outside florists and planners. If you've chosen a vendor unaffiliated with a farm, tell them you want to source flowers and greens locally.

heep growing seasons in mind. Do you dream of a bridal bouquet filled with peonies grown right down the road? You'll be looking at a springtime wedding then. "May is peak peony season here in Asheville and dahlias are the queen of fall flowers," says Niki. Ask local farmers for a list of blooms typically available in the month you plan to wed.

Understand pricing. While buying local can save dollars ("A peony grown here in May will certainly cost less than a peony imported from across the globe in December," says Niki), don't overestimate the





price cut. "Just because you are getting flowers from a local farm doesn't mean they are cheaper or that you should expect them to be less expensive," she says. "Growing high-quality flowers takes a lot of work and expertise."

Be flexible. For the freshest (and most budgetfriendly) flowers, choose a palette or vibe, then hand the reigns over to the farmers, who will harvest in-season blooms that suit your vision and accommodate your budget.

Buy in bulh. One guaranteed price buster is to order in bulk and do the arranging yourself. Some farms (such as Lady Luck Flower Farm and Full Sun Farm) are U-pick, while others, like Flourish, do the harvesting. "A good rule of thumb is that one of our buckets, which contain 75 to 100 stems, will fill about five to seven quart-size Mason jars," says Niki.

DLG half. To ensure freshness, bulk buckets are typically available for pick up one to three days prior to your event. Translation: Time for arranging is limited. A popular option? Let experts tackle your bouquets, boutonnières, and so on, then do reception arrangements yourself.

Head to a farm for portraits. Talk about Instagram gold! Many local flower farms welcome photo shoots for a small fee. "Try June through October, when the plants are taller and when dahlias are blooming," says Niki.

### How to Pose like a Pro

**Aim this way.** Since anniversaries are a celebration of you as a couple (and minus the 150 quests), pull out all the stops and make that mountain weekend you've always imagined a reality. Anniversary shoots are a great option for brides who wed in a convenient location but dreamed of a destination wedding with amazing views. Planning on flying into the 828? Book six weeks in advance to get the most budget-friendly flights.

Hit the spot. Seek out a local pro as master behind the lens. They know the ropes best, after all, and are oftentimes privy to those location "hidden gems" that out-of-towners may not be familiar with.

Dress up or down. There is no dress code for anniversary shoots. Want to wear your wedding gown? (Heck, you own it!) Consider altering it into a "little white dress" and hit the town with your suited up sweetheart. Or opt for something altogether different, like Caroline did with her black gown. The only caveat to remember? Bring two changes of clothes (one upscale and one down-to-earth) for options.


Gather your tribe. For those who want to relive their receptions, book your shoot, then have your nearest and dearest join you afterward for an anniversary party. Later, upload imagery to Shutterfly.com or PaperlessPost.com for holiday cards for years to come.

**Timing:** Don't want to wait for an anniversary? Try a shoot the day after your Big Day, especially if weather, temps, or timing gets gummed up the day-of.

Say cheese. Want to DIY your session? Grab a selfie stick and get down to it. "We're so fortunate that we have the luxury of iPhone cameras nowadays," says planner Tina Doody of Love & Honey, who suggests couples go mobile to document regular anniversaries and save hiring a pro for major ones. To create specialized shots and infuse extra personality into them, check out Snapchat for personal filters.

# Sno-Mance

When the weather outside is frightful, these tips on swapping "I do's" are so delightful

here is no doubt that Asheville all dressed up in winter is a sight to behold—dreamy snowcapped mountains in the distance, the crackling blaze of toasty fires, and city streets decked in twinkling lights abound. And as blissful as it all may be, it's also darn cold. We cozied up to Jennifer and Joe Mackey of JCM Photography to get the scoop on how a bride can star in her very own winter wonderland wedding while combatting the chill and looking polished all at once. For starters, they suggest a pre-Big Day consultation to hash out fair and foul weather plans. From there, read on for more of their been-there, done-that advice to make yours the merriest of weddings. —Catherine Lowe

### **Asheville Wedding Guide:** What are your three best pieces of advice for winter brides?

JCM Photography: First, contact your wedding planner to discuss any possible schedule adjustments and backup plans if snow looks eminent. Second, make time to get outside for bridal or couple portraits in the snow. It can make beautiful images on your wedding day. And lastly, tread carefully. Snowy weather can create slick conditions, so be careful as you move around outside, even if it's just going from one point to another.

# **AWG:** Got it. So say it does snow on my wedding day. Anything else I need to keep in mind?

**JCM:** Plan for things to be behind in terms of timing. When it snows heavily, it can delay guests, vendors, and even the bridal party from arriving on time. Don't stress and realize that pretty much everyone is going to be in the same boat.

### **AWG:** What if the snow is very deep and you're not up for photos in the thick of it?

JCM: We offer couples an "adventure" session prior to or after the wedding date. We head somewhere you'd never expect to go in your wedding garb, like a mountain bald or hiking trail. This ensures we have ample time to snap all the beautiful wedding imagery a couple desires. It takes the stress out of photo time (and snow).

### **AWG:** Let's talk fashion. Do you have any snowy style tips?

JCM: As you can imagine, trying to convince someone in a light dress and open-toed heels to go out into snowy weather can be a challenge. We recommend warm shoes [like] boots and something warm for your upper body, such as an elegant cape. If [your wrap] isn't stylish, you can always take it off for photos when you get outside. And it's not impossible if you don't have boots, you'll just have cold toes.

### **AWG:** Why should a couple choose to get married during the winter months?

JCM: It's considered the off-season since it's colder and a lot of venues offer lower rates. Since many of today's couples are paying for weddings out of their own pockets, this can be a great strategy to save on wedding costs while still being able to afford to get married in a popular area like Asheville.





# The Suite Life



Bethany suggests sending invitations four to six weeks in advance and even earlier for destination weddings or those that align with holidays.

the invitation. Same-sex couples can take
turns on who appears first on save-thedates, invitations, and ceremony programs.
Host parents are usually listed malefemale and are typically the bride's
parents and/or stepparents.

Bethany is a Jill of all trades—she creates custom invitations (like this suite), calligraphs envelopes, pens wedding signage, and even makes specialized aisle runners upon request. The first piece of information she requests from a bride is their wedding date. From there, she creates an individual timeline detailing important deadlines. Bethany's envelope calligraphy ranges from \$1.50 to \$4 per piece.

#### ENCLOSURE CARD

Also known as the details card, this catchall includes other relevant information regarding the Big Day, like directions, accommodation information, registry locations, and wedding website addresses. Have more to tell guests than one side of the card allows? Print information on the front and back.

#### REPLY CARD

These are used to collect RSVPs. Include a "reply by" date, usually three to four weeks prior to your wedding date.
